- Will Marshall, Co-Founder and CEO, Planet- Technology Disruptor:
 Will's leadership in creating Planet was instrumental in ushering in a
 NewSpace revolution, thus kick starting a phenomenon which is fast
 coming to be known as 'Democratization of Space'. With his vision and the
 advancements in communication technologies, software and artificial
 intelligence, geospatial business ecosystems are being redefined, creating
 newer avenues and opportunities of making difference, and laying the
 foundation for next decade.
- Mark Johnson, Co-Founder and CEO, Descartes Labs- Disruptor in the Making: Mark is known as a pioneer of Artificial Intelligence in the geospatial and data space. Under his leadership, Descartes Labs is building a data refinery for satellite imagery. The company has created a cloud-based supercomputer for the application of machine intelligence to sensor data. Descartes Labs processes data from the major constellations at scale to provide instant access to analysis-ready images of the entire world via a massive, searchable, on-demand interface.
- Steve Coast, Founder, OpenStreetMap- Social Disruptor: Steve's vision and leadership in creating OpenStreeMap (the free wiki map of the world) was a pioneering step in democratization of geospatial technology, bringing the power of maps in the hands of millions. Today, OSM is not only used by over 2 million active users, but is also the de-facto map for large chunks of the world, especially in developing parts of the world.
- Javier de la Torre, Co-Founder and CEO, CARTO- Technology Disruptor: As a student of Agriculture Engineering and Environmental Science, Javier de la Torre is passionate about data and its potential to improve the way decisions are made. By 2012, Javier discovered the magic of location intelligence, when he moved ahead and founded CARTO with a vision to democratize data analysis and visualization.
